1. Introduction

Article 38.2 of the Financial Regulation applicable to the general budget of the Union¹ stipulates that the Commission shall attach to the draft budget a financial programming for the following years in order to provide more precise and reliable forecasts of the budgetary implications of both legislation in force and of pending legislative proposals. Article 23 of the Rules of Application of the Financial Regulation provides that the financial programming shall be structured by category of expenditure, policy area and budget line. The complete financial programming shall cover all categories of expenditure with the exception of agriculture, cohesion policy and administration for which only summary data shall be provided. The financial programming remains indicative in nature and, as such, does not prejudge any decision the Commission or the Budgetary Authority might take in the future budgetary procedures.

Overall, the financial programming for 2016-2020 accompanying the draft budget (DB) 2015 is in line with the 2014-2020 Multi-annual Financial Framework (MFF). In comparison to the financial programming presented in its technical update of January 2014, some adjustments have taken place following adoption of the legal bases of spending programmes. They concern mainly a redistribution of the foreseen expenditure within the programmes, in order to be aligned with the decisions taken by the Legislative Authority.

In addition, the Commission has made a number of adjustments to the financial programming, including:

Heading 1a:

- The subscription to the capital increase of the **European Investment Fund** (**EIF**) requires an amount of EUR 178 million over the years 2014-2017, reflecting the invitation by the European Council in December 2013 to both the Commission and the European Investment Bank to build up the capacity of the EIF to respond to the needs to reconstitute normal lending to the economy, in particular to the small and medium-sized enterprises (SME). The sources for the funding are three-fold: **the Horizon 2020** programme (EUR 60 million); the programme for **the Competitiveness and Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (COSME)** (EUR 60 million) and savings made in 2015 for the subsidy to **the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA)** (EUR 58 million). The profile of Horizon 2020 and COSME has been frontloaded to take into account the contribution to the EIF in 2016 and 2017.
- For the Horizon 2020 programme, the financial programming has been established for the new joint undertaking Shift2Rail.

Heading 1b:

The Common Provisions Regulation (CPR)² foresees an additional EUR 100 million per year in current prices in 2014 and 2015 for **Cyprus**. As this heading is fully programmed except for the technical assistance, the amount to be deployed from **the Flexibility Instrument** in 2015 will be less than EUR 100 million taking into account the amount of technical assistance foreseen in the budget 2015. This additional allocation for Cyprus has no impact for the financial programming in years 2016-2020.

- Heading 4:

- A considerable increase is foreseen for the Guarantee Fund for external actions for years 2016-2017 due to the additional support for Ukraine in the form of loans, which will have an impact on the provisioning of the Guarantee Fund with a two-year time lag.
- The Commission proposes to increase the Instrument for Nuclear Safety Cooperation (INSC) by EUR 100 million over the years 2015-2017, to cover an additional contribution to the Chernobyl Shelter Fund.

The financial programming for 2016-2020 is summarised in the **Global summary table** (Annex 8.1 below) also showing the margins for all headings of the MFF as well as amounts outside the MFF ceilings. The indicative evolution by programme is summarised in the **Summary table by programme** (Annex 8.2). The annexed tables 8.3 to 8.7 provide a detailed breakdown by **Policy Area and budget line** under expenditure headings 1a, 1b, 2, 3 and 4, respectively. A separate financial programming for actions financed under the **prerogatives and specific competences conferred to the Commission** is illustrated in Table 8.8 and for the **decentralised agencies** in Table 8.9. A list of the **Pilot Projects and Preparatory Actions** is provided for information in Tables 8.10 and 8.11, although there is no financial programming for these actions. All figures refer to commitment appropriations.

The sections below provide a brief description of the programming period by MFF heading, illustrating in particular the main adjustments to the financial programming since the technical update of January 2014, including the changes due to adoption of the legal bases of the spending programmes.

2. HEADING 1A — COMPETITIVENESS FOR GROWTH AND JOBS

The financing under heading 1a of the INEA executive agency responsible for the management of the CEF has been decreased to balance the contribution from heading 1b to the financing of this executive agency.

Changes relating mostly to the prerogatives and specific responsibilities of the Commission.

* As the table shows the impact on the margin of the changes in the financial programming, the negative sign (-) in front of a figure means an increasing need of appropriations. The figures without the sign illustrate a decrease in the financial programming for the year in question. The new yearly margins present the estimated available margin for years 2015-2020.

Compared with the update of the financial programming of January 2014, some changes have been necessary following the adoption of the legal bases of the spending programmes and to incorporate new initiatives, in particular the subscription to the EIF capital increase and the new joint technology initiative Shift2Rail.

The total margin available under the MFF ceiling for the period 2015-2020 has been increased by EUR 31,3 million, leaving more room of manoeuvre to address future unforeseen needs, in particular in the last years of the present MFF.

Capital increase of the European Investment Fund (EIF)

The European Council of December 2013 invited the Commission and the European Investment bank (EIB) to further enhance the capacity of the EIF through an increase in its capital, thus moving towards the final aim of restoring normal lending to the economy, in particular to the SMEs.

To cover the cost of the capital increase of the EIF, the legislative authority decided to increase the contribution from the general budget of the European Union. The capital increase will be covered by appropriations already programmed within heading 1a for the period 2014-2020 in order to leave unchanged the total expenditure allocated.

In 2014, the Commission proposed to reallocate part of the funds originally programmed for the COSME and Horizon 2020 programmes (in a 50:50 ratio) to fund the capital increase under Amending Budget 1/2014. The proposal was approved by the Budgetary Authority. In addition, the Commission now proposes that part of the resources previously programmed as a contribution to the European Chemicals agency (ECHA) for years 2015, 2016 and 2017 be reallocated to the EIF capital increase, leaving unchanged the total expenditure allocated for heading 1a in line with the condition set by the legislative authority. As a consequence, a larger number of shares than initially foreseen can be subscribed already in 2015.

The table below illustrates the proposed sources of funding of the EIF capital increase.

HORIZON 2020

The allocations of the budget lines devoted to the financial instruments under the Horizon 2020 programme have been revised in the light of the reallocation of appropriations to the EIF capital increase. With a view to ensuring continuity of the actions in the field of financial instruments, the profile of the programme has been modified by a frontloading in 2016 and 2017, thus partially offsetting the impact of the contribution to the EIF. The compensation of the frontloading is foreseen in 2018-2020.

The financial programming of Horizon 2020 is revised taking into account the adopted legal basis of the Framework Programme for Research and Innovation (2014-2020). The adjustments include a revision of the

breakdown of appropriations between the indirect actions and direct actions as well as within the indirect actions between the research activities. A financial programming has been established for two budget lines created in the 2014 budget: 'Science with and for Society' and 'Spreading excellence and widening participation'. The programming for research activities 'Fostering inclusive, innovative and reflective European societies', resulting from the split of the research activity 'Fostering inclusive, innovative and reflective European societies', has been adjusted accordingly.

A revised financial programming is also foreseen for the budget line 'Horizontal activities of Horizon 2020', which is a build up from the contributions of all research activities for the period 2016-2020.

The revision of the financial programming of administrative support lines takes into account the adjustment of operational appropriations of each research activity, the delegation of tasks to the executive agencies, and the creation of the 'Common Support Centre' within the leading directorate general of the programme (DG Research and Innovation). In line with Amending Budget 1/2014, a financial programming of the **Shift2Rail Joint Undertaking** has been established for 2016-2020.

Programme for the Competitiveness of Enterprises and Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (COSME)

Due to the reallocation of funds for the EIF capital increase, the allocations of the budget line devoted to the financial instruments under the COSME programme was revised in 2014. As for Horizon 2020, the profile of the programme has been frontloaded in 2016-2017 to mitigate the effect of the contribution to the EIF, and to take into account the need to boost the financial instruments implemented by the European Investment Fund (EIF) in favour of enterprises (risk capital and guarantees instruments). The compensation for the frontloading is foreseen to take place in 2018-2020.

Connecting Europe Facility (CEF)

The distribution of amounts between the budget lines of the CEF Programme has been reviewed to align the breakdown with the percentages defined in the agreed legal base.

A redistribution of appropriations between administrative support lines contributing to the financing of **the Innovation and Networks Executive Agency (INEA)** has been foreseen up to 2020, taking into account the Cohesion Fund's contribution to its financing. The resources thus made available have been reallocated under the financial programming to the operational line 'Removing bottlenecks, enhancing rail interoperability, bridging missing links and improving cross-border sections'.

Standards in the field of financial reporting and auditing (FINSER)

Financial Reporting Advisory Group (EFRAG) will be limited to the period 2014-2016. The financial programming is revised accordingly; it is also proposed that the level of the appropriations in 2015 and 2016 is maintained at the level of 2013 in real terms. The agreed text of the legal act foresees that - if appropriate - the Commission shall submit a legislative proposal to continue the financing of EFRAG after 31 December 2016. Therefore, the financial programming indicates a possible extension of the contribution to EFRAG should the necessary conditions be fulfilled. Although the revision has a very limited impact in 2015 and 2016, the total allocation for the period 2014-2020 decreases by EUR 1,5 million.

Nuclear decommissioning assistance programmes in Bulgaria and Slovakia and in Lithuania

The financial programming reflects the adjusted budget nomenclature (at the level of the budget line numbering) of the three nuclear decommissioning assistance programmes, after adoption of the relevant Council Regulations.

EURATOM

The financial programming of the EURATOM programme has been revised to take into account the breakdown of appropriations between the indirect actions and direct actions as well as the lower ceilings for the indirect actions administrative expenditure in 2019-2020.

Decentralised agencies

In 2013, the fee revenues of the **European Chemicals Agency (ECHA)** – **chemicals legislation** have been substantially higher than initially foreseen. In the light of the 2013 outcome and of the experience gained, the agency was requested to provide updated estimates. Following the Commission's assessment, the initial financial programming has been revised downwards for years 2015, 2016 and 2017, while the allocation for 2018 has been revised upwards given the uncertainty over the fees revenues for that year, when the registration deadline concerns mainly small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs), which are entitled to reduced fees. Overall allocations to the agency have been reduced over the programming period. Part of the resources freed will be allocated to the EIF capital increase as set out above.

The Single Resolution Board (SRB) will receive a temporary allocation of EUR 3,3 million in 2015, to be fully reimbursed at the same year.

Changes in the programming of **other agencies**⁵ reflect adjustments of the EU subsidy to take account of the latest implementation records.

All the agencies in heading 1a are concerned by the fluctuations.

3. HEADING 1B — ECONOMIC, SOCIAL AND TERRITORIAL COHESION

The financial programming for Economic, social and territorial cohesion for the period of 2014-2020 corresponds to the resources as laid down in Articles 91 and 92 and Annex VI of the Common Provisions Regulation (CPR)⁶ for the European Structural and Investment Funds (ESIF). The precise yearly amounts by category are based on Commission Implementing Decision⁷.

The total allocation for Economic, social and territorial cohesion is broken down into two objectives: 'Investment for growth and jobs' and 'European territorial cooperation', plus a specific frontloaded top-up allocation for the 'Youth Employment Initiative'. Of the overall amounts for 'Investment for growth and jobs' (IGJ), specific amounts are dedicated to four different types of regions (Regional convergence, transition, competitiveness and outermost) and to the Cohesion Fund. The total allocation also covers: the 'Fund for European Aid to the most Deprived (FEAD)', the transfer from the Cohesion Fund to the Connecting Europe Facility (CEF), and 'Technical assistance and innovative actions'.

With the exception of technical assistance, heading 1b will be fully allocated to operational programmes, and legal commitments will be taken for the full period. The detailed amounts by Funds will depend on the content of the various programmes. There is accordingly no financial programming in heading 1b in the same meaning as for other headings.

In the attached Table 8.4, the technical assistance for the period 2014-2020 has been included up to its ceiling of 0,35 % of the overall 2014-2020 allocation. The actual amounts to be budgeted for technical assistance, which are normally lower than the ceiling, will be proposed each year in the draft budgets.

In line with Article 92(2) of the CPR, **Cyprus** will receive additional allocations of EUR 100 million in current prices in both 2014 and 2015, which are not foreseen under the Heading 1b ceiling. These amounts will be covered firstly by the initial margin left by technical assistance and secondly by a mobilisation of the Flexibility Instrument for the remainder, which will thus be lower than the EUR 100 million additional annual allocation for Cyprus.

From 2016 onwards the yearly margins will be limited to the potential margin left by technical assistance.

Heading 2 covers the two pillars of Common Agricultural Policy (CAP): the **European Agricultural** Guarantee Fund (EAGF) and the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development (EAFRD).

As under the previous MFF, there are provisions allowing **transfers between the two pillars of the CAP.** However, such transfers will now be possible in both directions. In addition to some transfers from the EAGF to the EAFRD resulting from transitional provisions, a new element called 'flexibility between pillars' has been introduced. The Member States may make available up to 15 % of their annual national ceilings for calendar years 2014 to 2019 for direct payments financed by the EAGF as additional support for measures under rural development financed under the EAFRD. Alternatively, the Member States may decide to make available as direct payments up to 15 % of the amount allocated to support for measures under rural development programming financed under the EAFRD in the period 2015–2020, with the option for specific Member States to go up to 25%.

Based on the notifications by the Member States received so far, the net impact of these transfers for the whole period 2014-2020 will be a reduction of the EAGF sub-ceiling by EUR 1 323,373 million to EUR 311 411,627 million, while the rural development allocations for 2014-2020 are reinforced by the same amount to EUR 96 900,425 million.

These additional appropriations for the rural development result, on the one hand, from transfers from the EAGF to the EAFRD of EUR 4 311,880 million relating to: (a) the voluntary adjustment of direct aids in the UK for an amount of EUR 296,3 million for budget year 2014, (b) the inclusion of the cotton national restructuring programme in Greece (EUR 4 million annually for 2014-2020) to the new generation of rural development programmes, (c) the transfer from unused direct aids of calendar years 2014 and 2015 (EUR 42,6 million for Germany and EUR 9 million for Sweden for each of these two years) and (d) the new flexibility between the two CAP pillars (EUR 3 884,380 million over the period 2015-2020) for France, Latvia and the

Article 14 of Regulation (EU) 1307/2013.

UK. On the other hand, there is a transfer from the EAFRD to the EAGF amounting to EUR 2 988,507 million over the period 2015-2020, resulting from the decision taken by Poland, Croatia, Malta and Slovakia to reinforce direct payments to farmers under the first pillar of the CAP.

As the annual amounts transferred between both pillars are rather stable, the overall profile for the so-called 'Net balance available to the EAGF' and rural development does not fundamentally change: the EAGF expenditure programmed at the level of this net balance is still slightly increasing over the period 2014-2020, while the annual envelopes for rural development are almost stable (see table below).

Heading 2 also covers two other spending programmes: the **European Maritime and Fisheries Fund** (EMFF) and the **LIFE** programme. The main changes in the financial programming compared to the latest programming are linked to the modifications that have been introduced during the legislative procedure (increase of the envelope under shared management for the EMFF and higher share of action grants for LIFE), a well as also to the impact of the delegation of tasks to executive agencies regarding these two programmes. While the overall envelope for these two programmes has not changed, the breakdown between the various budget lines has been modified to reflect the latest legal provisions.

5. HEADING 3 — SECURITY AND CITIZENSHIP

Compared with the updated financial programming of January 2014, only minor deviations can be signalled for the period 2016-2020. Over the 2015-2020 period the total margin of heading 3 increases by EUR 14,5 million, mostly in relation with the allocation to decentralised agencies. Some changes have been introduced with a view to implementing the amendments to programmes as adopted by the Legislative Authority in the course of the legislative procedure and to take into account new specific needs.

Concerning the **Justice programme** and the **Rights, Equality and Citizenship programme**, the distribution of amounts between the operational budget lines over 2016-2020 has been aligned according to the percentage shares for each specific objective (or group of objectives) as foreseen in the legal acts establishing the two programmes.

The financial programming of "**Communication actions**" has been adjusted upwards to take into account the investment required to modernise the institutional web presence in the EUROPA domain. The restructured web presence will be more coherent, focused on user needs, cost-effective as well as optimised for mobile devices and web 2.0 technologies.

Decentralised agencies

The decentralised agencies account for most of the increase of the margin for 2015.

The large-scale IT systems Agency (eu.LISA) is gradually taking over the management of the Home Affairs IT systems (SIS II, VIS and Eurodac), including the management of the networks with Member States. The financial envelope dedicated to the management of VIS, SIS II and Eurodac covers the recurrent and stable maintenance and management costs for the infrastructure at EU level. After some additional investments foreseen in 2014 and 2015, covering the VIS extended geographic coverage and the gradual integration of the biometrics aspects in the system as well as the agency building project, the profile of the contribution to eu.LISA is expected to become stable as from 2016.

The financial programming of the allocation to **the European Union's Judicial Cooperation Unit** (**EUROJUST**) has been adapted to cater for the back-loaded costs of the agency building project from 2015 - 2016 to 2017, due to delays in the construction and delivery of the new premises.

Due to the higher than foreseen fee revenues, the balancing contribution for **the European Medicines Agency** (**EMA**) in 2015 has been reduced by EUR 8,5 million.

In 2015, appropriations for all the other agencies in heading 3 are subject to adjustments to take account of assigned revenues arising from surpluses and implementation records.

The financial programming takes into account adjustments needed following the adoption of the legal bases of the financial instruments⁹. The margin available under the MFF ceiling for the years 2015-2020 decreases by EUR 115,1 million, mainly due to the proposed additional EU contribution to **the Chernobyl Shelter Fund** from **the Instrument for Nuclear Safety Cooperation (INSC)** and the financial support offered to **Ukraine** through **the Guarantee Fund for external action**. The financial programming also reflects the latest changes introduced by the legislative authority, such as the increase of **the Instrument for EU-Greenland Partnership**. A small reduction is foreseen for **the Union Civil Protection Mechanism** in 2015.

Several programmes (DCI, ENI, IPA II, PI, EIDHR, IcSP, HUMA) were reinforced in the context of the 2014 budget exercise in comparison to the financial envelopes of the respective legal bases.

The adjustments to the new **Instrument for Pre-accession assistance (IPA II)** have been carried out to take account of the evolution of the country strategy papers.

In 2015, the administrative expenditure of **the Development Cooperation Instrument (DCI)** has been decreased by five million Euros, which have been reallocated to the operational expenditure.

The financial programming for **the Partnership Instrument for cooperation with third countries (PI)** has been fine-tuned to take into account the needs for administrative expenditure and for the executive agency EACEA, implementing part of the programme. The differences have been added to or deducted from the operational appropriations.

The Commission proposes to increase the **Instrument for Nuclear Safety Cooperation (INSC)** by EUR 100 million in total for the years 2015 (EUR 30 million), 2016 (EUR 40 million) and 2017 (EUR 30 million), in order to cover the additional EU contribution to **the Chernobyl Shelter Fund** and then revert to a steady state.

The programming for the provisioning of **the Guarantee Fund for external actions** is based on the estimated disbursements and reimbursement patterns of loans to third countries guaranteed by the EU budget. The changes to the financial programming are mainly due to updated forecasts for the EIB and macro-financial assistance loans, including the additional support foreseen for Ukraine. The latter has an impact especially in 2016. The additional needs due to an increase of the new external mandate of the EIB in comparison to the Commission proposal have also been taken into account.

7. HEADING 5 — ADMINISTRATION

7.1 Introduction

For the period 2015-2020 the forecasted needs are based on the estimates of expenditure as communicated by all Institutions. The impact of the 0,8% salary adjustment adopted as of 1/7/2012 and an estimated adjustment of 1,7% at the end of 2015 (on a six month basis) are incorporated in the financial programming. An annual increase based on inflation has been applied for the period 2016-2020.

Pending the final decision of the legislative authority, **the Court of Justice** proposal for nine new judges has not been taken into account in the estimates for the period 2015-2020 (annual budgetary impact estimated at EUR 9 million). For **the European Data Protection Supervisor**, the figures integrate the annual budgetary impact of EUR 8 million for the creation of the European Data Protection Board, starting in 2016.

The appropriations related to the pension expenditure for the former Members of the Court of Justice, the Court of Auditors, the European Ombudsman and the European Data Protection Supervisor have been transferred into the Commission's section of the budget as from 2015.

During the consolidation of the estimates of other Institutions into the 2015 DB, the Commission has made changes¹⁰ to the estimates provided by **the European Council and Council, the Court of Justice of the European Union and the Committee of the Regions** (please see Document I for more details).

The forecasted needs over the period 2016-2020 constitute only a technical estimation by the administrations of the Institutions and do not take into account any further enlargements, for which any requests will be included in the estimates of expenditure of Institutions only once a formal decision on the date of accession is taken

7.2 Evolution of the Commission establishment plans

In addition to a reduction of 255 posts in 2015, the financial programming includes a further reduction of 455 posts for **the Commission** during 2016 and 2017 in the framework of the 5 % staff reduction as agreed in the new Inter-institutional Agreement.

Furthermore, the updated estimates take account of the budgetary impact on the Commission administrative expenditure under Heading 5 of the delegation of the management of 2014-2020 programmes to the executive agencies (-69 posts for the period 2016 - 2020).

7.3 Other Institutions

The Commission has promoted the strict approach that has been applied in its statement of estimates for human resources and other administrative expenditure to all the EU institutions and bodies.

The estimated global request of the other Institutions for 2015 is based on a net reduction of 65 posts. For the period 2016-2020 the other Institutions foresee a further reduction of their establishment plans by 135 posts.

Article 314 (1) of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union states that: "... each Institution shall ... draw up estimates of its expenditure for the following financial year. The Commission shall consolidate these estimates in a draft budget, which may contain different estimates."

For all Institutions, the budgetary estimates for the period 2016-2020 also take into account the savings generated by the review of the Staff Regulations.

7.4 Pensions and European schools

The estimate for expenditure of **the European Schools** for the period 2015-2020 is based on the assumption of the phasing-out of the European school 'Type I' in Culham (United Kingdom) by the end of the school year 2016-2017, and the need of additional premises to cope with the increase in the school population in Brussels as from end 2015. In addition it takes into account the phasing out of the EU contribution to the schools serving the staff of other institutions and bodies not financed from the EU budget¹¹.

The evolution of **pension expenditure** takes into account the integration of pension expenditure for the former Members of the European Parliament (as of the 2014 budget) and the former Members of the Court of Justice, the Court of Auditors, the European Ombudsman and the European Data Protection Supervisor into the Commission section of the budget as from 2015 (i.e. outside the sub-ceiling of administrative expenditure of the Institutions).

For **staff pensions**, the evolution of expenditure between 2016 and 2020 has been based on the annual variations forecasted in the Eurostat study on the long-term budgetary implications of pension costs.

Based on these assumptions, the margin for heading 5 is estimated to steadily increase over the period 2015–2020 in comparison to the margin of 2014.
