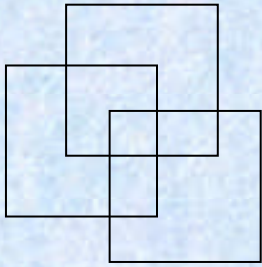

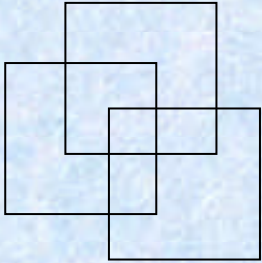


Impact of the crisis on Employment and Decent Work

 - ✓ The ILO 2008 Declaration on Social justice for a fair globalization
 - ✓ Latest estimates on Decent work (26.01.2010)

 - ✓ Labour rights and social dialogue; determining factors for Decent Work realization



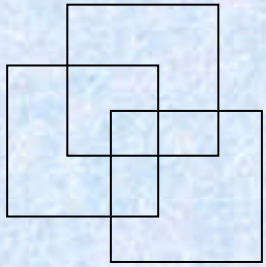
The global crisis requires a global way out

 - ✓ Emerging lessons

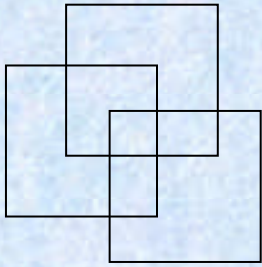


The way forward: recovering development
