1 On page 17, strike lines 9 through 24, and insert the  
2 following: “ance coverage shall, at a minimum provide cov-  
3 erage for and shall not impose any cost sharing require-  
4 ments for—

5 “(1) evidence-based items or services that have  
6 in effect a rating of ‘A’ or ‘B’ in the current rec-  
7 ommendations of the United States Preventive Serv-  
8 ices Task Force;

1           “(2) immunizations that have in effect a rec-  
2           ommendation from the Advisory Committee on Im-  
3           munization Practices of the Centers for Disease  
4           Control and Prevention with respect to the indi-  
5           vidual involved; and

6           “(3) with respect to infants, children, and ado-  
7           lescents, evidence-informed preventive care and  
8           screenings provided for in the comprehensive guide-  
9           lines supported by the Health Resources and Serv-  
10          ices Administration.

11          “(4) with respect to women, such additional  
12          preventive care and screenings not described in para-  
13          graph (1) as provided for in comprehensive guide-  
14          lines supported by the Health Resources and Serv-  
15          ices Administration for purposes of this paragraph.”.

16          “Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to prohibit  
17          a plan or issuer from providing coverage for services in  
18          addition to those recommended by United States Preven-  
19          tive Services Task Force or to deny coverage for services  
20          that are not recommended by such Task Force.”.
