The Beginnings of Regulatory Reform in Poland

- June 1999 A Conception of Medium Term Economic Development of Poland until the year 2002
- March 2000 Decision of the Polish government to undergo a review by the OECD of its regulatory practises and reforms
- September 2000 The Regulatory Quality Team is established



Regulatory Quality Team

- Advisory body to the Prime Minister
- High rank representatives
- Responsibilities
 - cooperation with the OECD team during the review
 - preparation of the draft documents on Regulatory Reform in Poland
 - implementation of the RIA into the Polish legal system



OECD Review of Regulatory Practises and Reforms in Poland

- Timescale (December 2000 – July 2002)
- The scope of the Review
- Conclusions and recommendations



The Introduction of Regulatory Impact Analysis (RIA)

- From November 2001 obligatory preparation of RIA for all government legislation
- Duty of conducting public consultation with all parties affected by the proposed legislation



Current Regulatory Policy Initiatives

- Implementation of the OECD review's conclusions and recommendations
- Promotion of Regulatory Impact Analysis (RIA)
- Simplification of administrative procedures for business



Implementation of the OECD review's conclusions and recommendations

- Responsibility of the Regulatory Quality team
- Program of implementation of the OECD review's recommendations
- Review of the extent to which the conclusions contained within the OECD report are being introduced



Promotion of Regulatory Impact Analysis

- Publication of guidelines on RIA (1st July 2003)
- Continuation of training programs for central government officials regarding the use of the RIA

Introduction of procedures aimed at simplifying business activity

- Simplification of registration procedures for new businesses (from 1st January 2004)
- Plans for further reduction of "red tape" for businesses announced in the draft Business Liberty Act
 - reduction of the number of licences and permits
 - further simplification of registration procedures for new businesses
 - automatic registration of permits for certain types of business activity instead of granting them by way of administrative decisions
 - limiting the number of governmental controls of businesses
