Rasmussen Reports Daily Presidential Tracking Poll

The Rasmussen Reports daily Presidential Tracking Poll for Tuesday again shows Barack Obama attracting 51% of the vote nationwide while John McCain earns 46%.

Battleground state polls released yesterday showed Obama leading in <u>Colorado</u>, <u>Florida</u>, <u>Ohio</u>, and <u>Virginia</u>. With these latest results, Rasmussen Reports has moved Florida from "Toss-Up" to "Leans Democratic."

In <u>Missouri</u> and <u>North Carolina</u>, the race remains a toss-up while McCain leads by five in his home state of <u>Arizona</u>. Rasmussen Reports <u>Electoral College projections</u> now show Obama leading 260-163. When "leaners" are included, Obama leads 313-174.

Later today, new polling data will be released for <u>Arkansas</u>, <u>Mississippi</u>, <u>Nevada</u>, and <u>Pennsylvania</u>. *Demographic crosstabs for all state polling are available for <u>Premium Members</u>. <u>Learn More</u>. Nationally, Obama has now been ahead by four-to-eight points every single day for 33 straight days. During that 33-day stretch, Obama's voter support has stayed between 50% and 52% every day while McCain has stayed in the 44% to 46% range (<u>see trends</u>).*

Obama is viewed favorably by 56% of voters nationwide, McCain by 53% (see trends).

<u>Rasmussen Markets</u> data shows Obama with an <u>87.9</u> % chance of winning in November (see market expectations for <u>key states</u>).

Daily tracking results are collected via telephone surveys of 1,000 likely voters per night and reported on a three-day rolling average basis. The margin of sampling error—for the full sample of 3,000 Likely Voters--is +/- 2 percentage points with a 95% level of confidence. Results are also compiled on a full-week basis and crosstabs for the <u>full-week results</u> are available for <u>Premium Members</u>.

Like all polling firms, Rasmussen Reports weights its data to reflect the population at large (<u>see methodology</u>). Among other targets, Rasmussen Reports weights data by political party affiliation using a dynamic weighting process. During the final two months of Election 2008, party weighting targets are updated each Sunday (see <u>additional information</u>). For polling data released during the week of October 26 to November 1, 2008, the partisan weighting targets used by Rasmussen Reports will be 40.0% Democratic, 32.8% Republican, and 27.2% unaffiliated.
